Scusi - Scusa	Excuse me (<i>formal - informal</i>)
Senta - Senti	<i>Formal - informal</i> : used to catch someone's attention (like “Listen”)
Accanto	Besides, next to
Vicino	Near, nearby
Dietro	Behind
Sai indicarmi...?	Can you show me ...? (<i>informal</i>)
Mi sa indicare ...?	Can you show me ...? (<i>formal</i>)
Sai dirmi...?/Mi sa dire ...?	Can you tell me...? (<i>informal/formal</i>)
Da queste parti	In this area/ near here
Fammi pensare	Let me think (<i>informal</i>)
Un attimo	A moment
Cammina fino a	Walk up to (<i>informal</i>)
Gira a destra	Turn right (<i>informal</i>)
Gira a sinistra	Turn left (<i>informal</i>)
laggiù	Over there
Prosegua	Go on/ go further (<i>formal</i>)
Continua	Go on/ go further (<i>informal</i>)
Le poste	<i>Plural</i> . Slang for “Post Office” (Ufficio Postale)
Farmacia	Chemist's
Biblioteca	Public Library
